

## From the Pastor's Desk...

By now you have likely heard that I will be making a trip to Kenya, Africa with a group from the Southwest Ohio Northern Kentucky Association of UCC churches. Here's how that happened.

Back in the Spring of 2012, you may remember, we had a mission guest from Rubate, Kenya, Joel Ngatiari, the President of the Presbyterian Teachers' College. David's UCC and the congregations of SONKA had a special relationship with the people of Rubate over the years, sharing together in the work of mission. Under the leadership of the late Rev. Bill Youngkin (longtime pastor here at David's) and others in SONKA, there has been significant financial support for the building and equipment needed for the fully operational medical clinic and hospital, now serving the needs of the College and nearby communities.

The Rubate Partnership has remained a joyful relationship for the people of SONKA and many of David's UCC, with regular visits to Africa from the people of SONKA and return visits from Kenyans. Pastors Bill and Becky Erb Strang made several trips, and most recently Becky Leighty and Eli Pence traveled on a mission trip in 2009 to maintain the spirit of goodwill between our two faith communities.

You may remember that when Mr. Ngatiari spoke here at David's Church on that Sunday morning, he asked for financial help to create a new water system to allow the hospital and college to better serve the needs of their rural community. During a season of drought, the bore hole well funded by SONKA previously had gone dry, and often patients at the clinic had to be turned away un-helped as there was not enough clean, fresh water to treat them. Joel spoke very directly of this need asking our church and our partners in SONKA to help raise the \$60,000 necessary to build a new water delivery system. The people of David's responded very generously, donating over \$13,000 to the cause, and by the Spring Meeting of SONKA last year, the full amount had been raised. Thanks be to God! And, thank you to all who donated.

We've since learned that the project to put in place this water delivery project has been completed. When our group travels to visit Rubate, we will participate in a blessing of the new system. I'm very grateful to Sue Walters and the Church Council that voted unanimously, last year, for David's Church to support me financially so that I can attend these events with the group from SONKA. For that kind and generous support I thank the people of David's Church. It feels like this is an important mission relationship to maintain for the years and generations to come, and now that we've lost Rev. Bill Youngkin it feels like an important time for someone from David's Church to visit Kenya.

So, I've been trying to learn about what I can expect from travel to northern Africa, Kenya is an equatorial country, I got the necessary shots to equip my immune system to deal with exposure to illnesses that we don't worry much about here in the First World of SW Ohio. As you can imagine, this has created a sense of anticipation and hopefulness, as well as the usual level of anxiety that travelers experience when encountering a new place, new people and culture for the first time. I'll admit, it's a touch outside my comfort zone, but that makes me even more eager to go... I've rarely learned anything new while hiding safely in my comfort zone.

I have been to Africa once before. In May of 1976, I traveled with a group from college on a tour of the Holy Lands, so we had a couple days each in Rome, Athens (Corinth) and Cairo, Egypt, before traveling to Israel for a ten day exploration of the land of Jesus, the Palestinians and the Hebrews. My memories of that brief visit to Cairo include a trip to the National Museum to see the relics retrieved from the burial crypt of King Tut, and exposure to some of the greatest poverty I've ever experienced on the streets of that ancient city and in the country surrounding it.

So, dear friends, I look forward to making this journey, honoring the historic relationships between David's Church and SONKA and the good people of Rubate. And, again, I'm thankful for the Church Council and David's Church people who are making this trip possible for me. I anticipate learning more about our collaborative work there in the hospital, and imagine again experiencing the world through the eyes of people who have learned to live meaningfully while coping with crushing need. I pray for open eyes to see the world clearly, and an open mind and heart so that God's work and blessings are not obscured in the lives of these wonderful people, that I can see clearly the difference made possible by access to fresh water, and the healing presence of the clinic and college.

Over half of the 10 who will travel to Kenya, are young adults, several in their 20s, but 4 that are high school age. Many of them are struggling with fund-raising to come up with the \$3 thousand to \$3500 that the trip will cost. My expenses are covered, as I've said, thanks to David's Church, but if you would like to contribute to help ease the way for these young people from SONKA to make this trip of a life time, perhaps in memory of Bill Youngkin, you can do so by sending a check to David's marked for SONKA/Rubate trip. While we are there, we will be giving an additional gift to the people that house and care for us at the Teacher's College compound and Hospital, so any moneys collected above and beyond our travel needs will be part of that gift.

Finally, I would invite your prayers, for safety as we travel at from June 24 – July 9, and also for the people of Rubate, Kenya, that God may continue to bless the work that we share in together.

## Graduation Recognition






