

From the Pastor's Desk...

There's a lot of negativity in the world these days. I don't mean to add to the negativity by pointing it out, but we might as well admit that that's the current climate many of us are swimming in. Perhaps so much so, that many of us have abdicated our positive assumptions, and just embraced this seeming "reality." And, if negativity is a given, many of us are prone to be proactively negative, you know, to fight fire with fire. We won't wait to be bruised, hurt or offended, we're going to travel thru life armed and ready to make a first strike if necessary.

No doubt, some of the negativity has to do with the accelerated rhetoric of the coming electoral season, which the media keeps warning us is going to be the most negative election cycle in years, as if the media have nothing to do with the level of the social discourse these days. There may be some truth to that, and plenty of blame to go around to both sides of the political debate.

Some have also said, the cultural negativity is an outcome of a depleted economy. That even though there are some signs of recovery, although far slower than we'd all like, but higher prices for gas and food staples and the uncertainty and anxiety of our economic markets in flux have left a lot of us feeling uncertain. The result is greater suspicion, declining civility and less positive expressions in the culture around us, as tensions rise both externally and internally.

That's a challenge for those of us who are Christians, who claim to take our lead from the life and teaching of Jesus. Writing to the Galatians, the Apostle Paul suggests that the fruit in the lives of those who are living in Christ's Spirit would be: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things... If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another (5:22-26)."

Paul seems to be warning the church about letting the negative spirit of their age infiltrate and diminish the spirit and faith of believers. Or, as e.e. cummings suggests in this poem, to say "yes" to what is, and not respond to life with a "no":

*i thank You God for most this amazing
day: for the leaping greenly spirits of trees
and a blue dream of sky; and for everything
which is natural which is infinite which is yes*

*(i who have died am alive again today,
and this is the sun's birthday; this is the birth
day of life and love and wings; and of the gay
great happening illimitably earth)*

*how should tasting touching hearing seeing
breathing any - lifted from the no
of all nothing - human merely being
doubt unimaginable You?*

*(now the ears of my ears awake and
now the eyes of my eyes are opened)*

cummings invites us to consider the positive message of Spring's rebirth all around us, how all of nature responds to God's gift of tree and sky with a "yes." I hesitate to use "should" language, but if we're really alive, says the poem, we're at our best if we're tasting, touching, hearing, seeing, and breathing in all of life, living passionately, wholly, and well. The goal of life is engagement, moving beyond the shelter, no longer hiding our feelings for fear of a negative response, no longer bound to an immediate "no" to life. When life opens up to us, when we learn to trust the "yes" of faith, the possibility of God's Spirit in and through us so that we can bear such impossibly incongruous fruits as the one's named above... kindness, gentleness, patience and generosity, love and peace and joy, we are on the path of rebirth in Christ.

As our year moves us from Spring into Summer, let us not lose sight of the new life breaking forth around us and, if we let it, within us. In the movie "Stranger Than Fiction" (mentioned in my Easter sermon), the prime character Harold Crick carries around a notebook tallying his day to decide if he's living in comedy or a tragedy. We could do the same, to see if are we saying "yes" to life, are we open to positive outcomes, are we open to others and our best true selves, or are we programmed to say "no," to lock things down in fearful anxiety and insecurity rather than risk a negative response?

You've probably heard the story about the Native American grandfather talking to his young granddaughter. She tells him, "it's like I have two wolves inside me, one that is mean and angry and wants to eat everyone I meet, and another

that's friendly and kind and gentle." Then she asks, which one of them will rule my personality, which one controls me? After a moment the grandfather says, "the one you feed."

At David's Church, we seek to feed that which is positive, that which nurtures in ourselves and each other the Fruit of the Spirit. Here we strive to feed the wolf inside that points in the direction of faith, hope and love. This is the journey we are on, and it's always easier, better, more fun, when we're on the road together. Hope to see you in church.



From the Board of Deacons

Recently Anne Jones sent an email to the board chairs informing them that she was cleaning out church files. Chairs were requested to pick up the folders and go through and return what we felt must be saved. Since I do everything that Chris and Anne tell me to do, I picked up the Deacons folders. Going through this was mostly old meeting minutes going back 18 years. But I did find a rather amusing (in an ironic sort of way) letter sent to the congregation by then chair, Jim Clark. It was dated in December 1993 and was informing the congregation that we were short on the stewardship pledges when compared to the expected expenses of the “Bare Bones” budget for 1994. Jim proposed a “Buck a Week or More” campaign in which slips of paper were made available to the people of David’s Church to fill out and return. This was amusing to me in that we always think that things have changed so much, especially in medical advancement and IT gadgets, but in reality, nothing has changed too much, especially when it comes to Deacons/Budgets/Stewardship Campaigns. Jim Clark’s request is of course a mirror image of the last two years of requests from the current board of Deacons, in 2011 it was “\$8 More per Month” and in 2012 it is “\$5 More per Week”.

David’s People have always been a responsive congregation in terms of adding a little more to the offering plate. And believe me, WE ARE GRATEFUL to all of you in your continued dedication to making and completing your pledge commitments. The staff and boards always look for ways to save money, like handing out statements to save the postage. So it is always a good thing to remind ourselves that every dollar received is needed and well spent, both in operations and in mission work. Some things to consider:

As we approach the summer season please remember to keep your pledge commitment up to date. The Operations/Bills of the church do not take a vacation.


For the first quarter of 2012 our pledges are \$11,000 under budget and our pledge income when compared to the same timeframe of last year is \$20,000 less. Our expenses for the first quarter of 2012 are \$5000 below budget and we have had a modest gain for the year of \$7200. But expenses are usually heavier in the last half of the year, so the modest year to date gain will dry up quickly. Running a church our size and offering the programs you have stated you want to have takes resources, as most things in life. Therefore if you can throw some extra into the offering plate, please do so.

May God continue to bless our church and may we strive to continue the work that Christ started so many years ago.

“Re-Claiming the Bible for a Non-Religious World” Book Study with Pastor Brian on Mondays after Easter



Dr. Newcomb is offering a book study around the latest tome from Bishop John Shelby Spong, “Re-Claiming the Bible for a Non-Religious World” (HarperOne), on Monday evenings, at 7:00 p.m. in the Conference Room.

While almost all Christians say that the Bible is the primary witness and authority in the life of the Church, some refer to it as God’s Word. Yet many of us have trouble actually reading it. Whether it’s the fact that it’s an ancient text, written in two “dead” languages for people and faith communities in a world long gone, or that some of our neighbors have stripped quotes from the Bible’s original context to use it as a blunt instrument in arguments and theological debates about everything from the origins of the earth and humanity, to the meaning and purpose of the life of Jesus, and how we are to be and act as people of faith today, many of us find the Bible inaccessible and beyond understanding.

The book “explores the origin and essential meaning of each of the individual books in the Bible, examining the background, the context, the level of authenticity and even the trustworthiness of the messages found there... he explains why these particular books, written between two and three thousand years ago, came to be regarded as authoritative and preserved as sacred.”

If you plan to attend, we invite you to arrange to get a copy of the book, and then read the assigned pages before we gather. Our 90-minute classes will give us a chance to ask questions, discuss the book’s strengths and weaknesses and enter into thoughtful dialogue. Here is the class & reading

schedule:

April 30 – Parts VII & VIII; Liturgical Books & Wisdom Literature, and Introducing the Christian Scriptures, Commonly Called the New Testament

May 7 – Part IX (Chaps. 31 – 40); Paul: The First New Testament Writer

(May 21 – no class – we will cover the information the week before and after) – Chap. 41 (of Part IX) – Chap. 49 (of Part X); Post-Pauline Epistles, and The Synoptic Gospels (Mark, Matthew & Luke)

June 4 – Chap. 50 (Part X) – Part XI; Acts and The Pastoral Epistles, Hebrews and the General Epistles

June 11 – Part XII; The Johannine Corpus
